

I am a junior college student studying the social sciences, specifically Criminology, Psychology and

Sociology. I have never had trouble reading any of my other textbooks however, this is a different story. The setup of the pages is hard to understand. The author uses good examples however, he uses far too many and goes in depth way too quickly. I have talked to other students and they have the same issues. Once you are done reading a chapter (usually about 30 pages a chapter), you do not even know what you just read.

This book is a disaster, it uses many big words and long paragraphs to explain simple concepts. It extremely boring, and it is very difficult to extract the little useful information it has. I only read it because I had to for college, and I did so bits by bits.

Very well written, and the format was easy to read - wonderful book. The writings on Sutherland and the multistage approach to defining white collar crime is excellent.

The book itself was in good quality, but I hardly ended up using it in my White Collar Crime class -___- But it got here just in time and was very informative :)
